Communication Tips

Address the individual by name first
Speak directly, simply, slowly and at a normal volume
Try to make eye contact
Avoid broad open-ended questions
Provide a non-verbal communication board

Behaviors You Should Not Ignore

Destructive Activities
Violent Tantrums
Loud or inappropriate interaction with other patrons
Violent Tantrums



Behavior Tips

Offer to help the caregiver and be empathetic Sit next to the person with autism Redirect attention Ask common social questions Offer to relocate other patrons



Emergency Tips

Contact security
Call 911
Do not touch the individual
Avoid standing too close

Relationship Building Tips

Don't be condescending
Be aware of your own attitude and avoid being judgemental
Don't consider the caregiver as an intermediary
Be an amassador
Give a tour of your library
Know where your autism materials are located
